<p>In collaboration with the Center for Environmental Research and Information - Eko Svest, the CEA has developed a study analyzing state aid for renewable energy sources (RES). This study compares the legal framework in North Macedonia with that of EU member states, aiming to provide conclusions, guidelines, and recommendations for policy changes and best practices.</p> <p>Description:</p> <p>An important part of the Republic of North Macedonia's obligations in the process of EU integration is the implementation of the Directive on renewable energy sources ((EU) 2018/2001), which mandates an increase in the share of renewable sources in energy consumption. In response, the government has established a mechanism with measures to support the production of electricity from renewable sources, which has been in place with certain modifications since 2007.</p> <p>The study provides an overview of the state of RES in North Macedonia, detailing the support measures for RES, financial payments to preferred producers, and the legal treatment of feed-in tariffs and premiums, viewed through the lens of state aid. While RNM has made strides in solar and wind energy, achieving production levels of 23 GWh and 97 GWh, respectively, from 2011 to 2018, the continued reliance on hydropower limits the overall potential for sustainable energy growth. Therefore, it is recommended that the government implements supportive measures, such as competitive bidding processes, to encourage investment in solar, wind, and bioenergy projects.</p> <p>Additionally, the promotion of preferential tariffs and premiums should be optimized to incentivize new RES projects, aiming to fulfill national energy consumption targets while contributing to environmental protection efforts.</p>

<p>The project, funded by the European Union through the European Instrument for Democracy and Human Rights, aimed to enhance social responsibility in the Republic of North Macedonia by addressing both civic and governmental accountability. On the civic side, it employed evidence-based research and awareness-raising initiatives to boost tax morale while simultaneously strengthening government transparency and accountability. This initiative introduced an innovative approach based on behavioral economics to inform policy-making and improve public services, ultimately delivering positive outcomes for individuals and communities regarding tax morale and compliance.</p> <p>The primary objective was to foster civic responsibility in North Macedonia through enhanced tax citizenship. This involved inductively motivating and promoting active, responsible citizenship that recognized the social importance of taxes while ensuring that government expenditures were transparent and efficient, thus facilitating human development and social cohesion. By the end of the project, it aimed to identify the key factors influencing tax morale among citizens through the practical application of behavioral insights and evidence-based research.
